Application to An Bord Pleanála
O'Flynn Construction Co. Unlimited Company intend to apply to An Bord Pleanála for a 5-year planning permission for a strategic housing development at Old Fort Road, Ballycolly, Cork.
The development will consist of:
a) The construction of 123 no. residential units in 3 no. blocks which range in height from 3 to 6 storeys and comprising a mix of 1 & 2 bed apartments;
b) 1 no. creche / childcare facility, internal residential amenity space and residents gym;
c) The provision of landscaping and amenity areas including play/amenity areas at podium level;
d) The provision of a set-down area, footpaths, cycle lane and table-top junction arrangement at the access to the development on the Old Fort Road; and
e) All associated ancillary development to include pedestrian/cyclist facilities, lighting, drainage, boundary treatments, bin storage, plant, ESS Sub-station and bicycle, motorcycle and car parking provided at ground and under-croft level.
The application contains a statement setting out how the proposed development is consistent with the objectives of the 2014 Cork County Development Plan, 2017 Ballycolly - Carrigaline Municipal District Local Area Plan and the 2015 Cork City Development Plan.

Submissions or observations duly made will be considered by An Bord Pleanála in making a decision on the application. Such submissions or observations must also include the following information:

c. the reasons, considerations and arguments on which the submission or observations is or are based.
An Bord Pleanála may grant permission for the strategic housing development as proposed, or may grant permission subject to such modifications as it specifies in its decision, or may grant permission in part only, with or without any other modifications it may specify in its decision, or may refuse to grant permission for the proposed development. An Bord Pleanála may attach to a grant of permission such conditions as it considers appropriate.
